Help Save Bolivar Flats

The Houston Audubon Society is undertaking its largest and perhaps most significant habitat conservation project to date. Bolivar Flats has been recognized as an Important Bird Area in the IBA program. The protected habitat serves as a sanctuary for several shorebirds that are in critical decline such as piping plover and red knot. Additionally, it serves as a nesting area for many species whose habitat is declining on the Upper Texas Coast.

In the 1990's, HAS worked with many individuals and with the State of Texas to conserve the areas along Rettilon Road. Now, the most critical area of the Bolivar Flats, the wetlands on the side towards the jetty, have come up for sale. This property is the area in which the massive numbers of avocets, pelicans, gulls and shorebirds can be seen roosting.

After careful deliberation, the Houston Audubon Society has undertaken to acquire almost 700 acres. We have one year to raise slightly over \$700,000 to preserve this habitat. In addition to fulfilling our mission of conservation, this area is open to the public for viewing opportunities year round.

This year we're going to explore a new place! Prairie View Camp is located on the south bank of the Arkansas River, just southeast of Arkansas City.

Join us May 4-6 for a weekend of fun in the outdoors. There will be special activities for kids, lots of birds, beautiful scenery, and good company.

Prairie View Camp is located right on the banks of the Arkansas River. It has woods and prairie along with swinging bridges and a nature trail. It is also in the midst of the Kaw Wildlife Area. A full weekend of nature activities and field trips is planned, or you can just relax and enjoy the beautiful countryside on your own. On Saturday night there is a barbecue dinner on the beach at Chaplin Nature Center, complete with a nature scavenger hunt for kids, night hikes, campfire music and entertainment, night hike, and a star program. This event is not just part of the Family Camping Weekend, but also open to all our members, and a thank you to the donors who make Chaplin Nature Center possible.

Accommodations:

Prairie View Camp has three dormitories with twelve rooms each. Each room has its own bathroom and beds for up to six people. Bring your own bedding - linens are not

provided. If you like to camp, you can pitch a tent. Restrooms and showers are available for campers to use. There are no electrical hookups in the camping area. Meals are prepared by the camp staff and are served in the dining hall.

Drive south from Arkansas City on Highway 77. Turn east on 312th Rd (less than 1/2 mile south of the Arkansas River bridge.) Follow 312th Rd approximately 3 miles to the Prairie View Christian Camp gate.
