BUTTERFLY COUNT

The 5th annual Arkansas City Butterfly Count was held on July 10th. This count uses the same count circle as the Arkansas City Christmas Bird Count and is an official count of the North American Butterfly Association. Ten adults and three kids helped us count. We had a good day for butterflies, with especially large numbers of Little Yellows and Dainty Sulphurs. Hackberry Emperors were the most numerous, as they are every year. We finished with a total of 744 individuals of 46 species. Mark your calendars for July 9th, 2011 and join in the fun.

FALL NATURE DAY, CONTINUED


