Join Lorrie Beck on a virtual visit to the coldest, driest, windiest and least visited continent on Earth. No worries about seasickness or hypothermia on this visit, as you'll enjoy close-up views of many of the wild creatures that call Antarctica home. Lorrie visited Antarctica in 2009 (December – Christmas), and that cruise/expedition represented the 7th – and final – continent she has visited during her years of travel with family and friends.

We know Lorrie best as the Director of the Great Plains Nature Center, which ended with her retirement in 2014. After a 2-year stint with the U.S. Peace Corps, Lorrie returned to Kansas and began pursuing a career in her major: Outdoor Recreation. She was hired by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in 1984, then transferred to the U.S. Fish and

Wildlife Service. In 1993, she began a 21-year career with the Service at stations in Alaska, Denver, and finally Wichita, Kansas. She joined the staff of the Great Plains Nature Center in 2001 as a park ranger and naturalist. She finished her federal career as the Director of the Great Plains Nature Center.

While employed and now retired, Lorrie continues to be involved with many volunteer activities, such as Habitat for Humanity both locally, nationally, and internationally. She currently serves on the Wichita Habitat for Humanity Board of Directors. Church remains important to Lorrie and her mother, and they are busy with various ministries, such as volunteering at the Lord's Diner and the Kansas Food Bank. Lorrie was recently appointed as the co-chair of the Wichita Alternative Gift Market. which is an arm of Alternative Gifts International.

Birdathon


