March Meeting

Come learn about one of our favorite birding destinations as Curtis Wolf presents "Welcome (back) to Cheyenne Bottoms and the Kansas Wetlands Education Center." Many people in the hunting and birding communities are very familiar with Cheyenne Bottoms as a must-see destination for their trades.



However, many others know very little about the awesome wetland resource that lies right here in Central Kansas. Did you know Cheyenne Bottoms is the largest wetland in the interior of the U.S.? Curtis will describe the importance of Cheyenne Bottoms, showing many photos, videos, and recordings of some of the unique avian visitors that call the Bottoms home. We will also discuss some of the recent improvements that have been made at Cheyenne Bottoms to improve wildlife habitat. Finally, we will reintroduce the work of KWEC.

Curtis Wolf is the director at the Kansas Wetlands Education Center (KWEC) at Cheyenne Bottoms near Great Bend, KS. The KWEC opened in April 2009 and is operated as a branch of Fort Hays State University's Werth College of Science, Technology and Mathematics. Curtis received a Bachelor of Science degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Biology at FHSU and his Master of Science degree in Biology at FHSU, studying freshwater mussels. Curtis sees his KWEC job as a wonderful opportunity to combine his passions of biology and education. Curtis loves anything outdoors, including hunting, fishing, camping, gardening, and lawn work. He also enjoys cooking and processing smoked meats. Curtis lives with his two dogs, Cheyenne and Moose, on a farm near Ellinwood, KS.
