## May Meeting

Our May presentation will be "Birding Kansas Throughout the Year," by Kevin Groeneweg, full-time birder and part-time WAS treasurer.

Kansas is blessed with a wide variety of birds that can be seen throughout the year. Because we are situated in the central flyway, we see a great diversity of birds during spring and fall migration. Having a wide variety of physiographic regions across our state, including the forested regions of the east, the Flint Hills, the Arkansas River lowlands and the high plains of the

west, it is little wonder that our state bird checklist contains 477 species. Kevin will take us on a month-bymonth journey and tell us when and where to find birds in Kansas.

#### May 19, Saturday, 8 a.m. Slate Creek Wetlands

Slate Creek Wetlands is the Pearl of the Prairie, a unique ecosystem with ties to when Kansas was admitted to statehood. This wetland complex plays hosts to a variety of migrating shorebirds, waterfowl, other waterbirds, sparrows, flycatchers and raptors. Expect to see migrating shorebirds, terns, herons, rails, and lingering or nesting waterfowl. We will meet at Slate Valley Baptist Church at 8 am. Bring boots and mosquito spray. Water conditions will determine the amount of walking required. We will go to Chaplin Nature Center for lunch and do some more birding there in the afternoon.

#### June 16, Saturday, 8 a.m. Derby Canoe Launch and Calhoun Acres

Take K-15 to 63rd St S, turn west, cross the river, then turn south at Grove. Follow Grove to the T junction with Cider Street. Turn left and Cider curves to become 71st Street.
