

CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNTS ARE FREE!

If you have helped with a Christmas Bird Count in the past you know that all counts reported to the National Audubon Society required a \$5 fee from each participant. Begining this year, Audubon will no longer charge the fee of field participants. Second, to minimize the effects of the loss of fee income, American Birds will no longer be printed on paper and mailed to participants, and Audubon will move to an online delivery of the summary results of the CBC.

These events are all-day efforts to census all birds within 15-mile diameter circles. The results are reported to the National Audubon Society and Kansas Ornithological Society. Remember to dress for the weather and expect to do a fair amount of walking. Most counts have a compilation at the end of the day. This is the 113th year for Christmas bird counts, and the 59th year of the Wichita count. For more Kansas counts, check the KOS website at www.ksbirds.org
