November Meeting

Our November program will be "Returning the Black-footed Ferret to Kansas - a challenging prospect," by Dr. Sandy Wilson. Dr. Wilson has been working at the Sedgwick County Zoo for the past 19 years and was recently appointed Director of Animal Health. She has been coordinating the Zoo's participation in the annual black-footed ferret survey conducted in Logan County each fall. She will share stories of what it is like to search for the elusive ferrets, how and why we trap them, and the information we learn from doing veterinary examinations of the animals.

Sandy and her husband Mitch live on an acreage near the town of Sedgwick. They once raised cattle, sheep and poultry, but now just maintain a small flock of sheep and a few chickens, along with their dog and two house cats. New Windows at CNC

We've done a lot of work on the naturalist's residence at Chaplin Nature Center this year. We installed a new furnace and air conditioner, replaced carpet, painted the exterior, and now replaced all the windows with new energy efficient models. A big thanks to Bob Gress, Kevin Groeneweg, Shawn Silliman and Pete Janzen for doing the installation. And an extra thanks to Pete for the donation of one window, along with assistance in measuring and ordering.



CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNTS

These annual events are all-day efforts to census all birds in an established 15-mile wide diameter circle, and is organized by a count compiler. Volunteers count every bird they see or hear all day. It's not just a species tally—all birds are counted all day, giving an indication of the total number of birds in the circle that day.

If you are a beginning birder, you will be able to join a group that includes at least one experienced birdwatcher. If your home is within the boundaries of a CBC circle, then you can stay at home and report the birds that visit your feeder on count day as long as you have made prior arrangement with the count compiler. The results are reported to the National Audubon Society and the Kansas Ornithological Society.

Remember to dress for the weather and expect to do a fair amount of walking. Most counts have a compilation at the end of the day. Inform the compiler if you plan to attend so they can plan ahead. There are lots of counts to choose from, so come join in the fun! And you can find still more counts on the Kansas Ornithological Society webpage at www.KSBirds.org.
